

## Welcome to the Audi Club SoCal High-Performance Driving School Buttonwillow Raceway Park November 17-19, 2023

Fellow Performance Driving Enthusiast,

Thank you for joining us at Buttonwillow for the Audi Club High Performance Driving School! We are looking forward to a safe, fun, and educational driving school; one where we will revel in the camaraderie of fellow Audi enthusiasts and enjoy our cars in a way just not possible on the public roads.

**First and foremost, this is not a racing school!** The purpose of this driving school is to improve your personal driving skills while learning about your car's capabilities. **Safety** throughout the entire event is of utmost importance!

If you need to refresh yourself on the event details, they may be reviewed on the driving school registration pages at <a href="www.msreg.com/BW23">www.msreg.com/BW23</a>. Here for your convenience are some important reminders. The first three are mandated by our insurance – if we don't have this information then you won't be able to drive!

1. **Tech Inspection** - Your car's mandatory **Safety Inspection** (colloquially known as "tech inspection") must be complete and in our hands before you arrive at the event. The inspection may be completed by your dealer's service department, an independent shop, or by another mechanically competent individual whom you have determined is qualified to evaluate your vehicle for safe condition. Once inspected, and you have signed the bottom of your completed tech form, please email a copy to <a href="mailto:AudiSoCalRegistrar@gmail.com">AudiSoCalRegistrar@gmail.com</a>. Note that the Audi Club tech inspection form has been updated for this event and a copy of the new form is included in this Welcome Letter. The form may also be downloaded from our website.

**Your Registration Status** - Please go to the <u>See Who is Attending</u> page on MSReg. Most of you are all set. A few have a status of "On Hold" meaning you still need to complete one or more of these items:

- 2. **Audi Club membership** Your membership must be valid through November 30, 2023, or later. We can't always verify expiration dates independently. Please join or renew your ACNA membership as needed to meet this requirement and email a copy of your membership page at member.audiclubna.org showing the expiration date to <a href="mailto:AudiSoCalRegistrar@gmail.com">AudiSoCalRegistrar@gmail.com</a>.
- 3. **SpeedWaiver** Liability waivers for *everyone* entering the track are required by our insurance. This includes **you** and all your **guests**. If you haven't completed your SpeedWaiver please do so NOW using the personalized link sent to your phone. If you can't find the link, use the same generic link we ask you to send to your Buttonwillow guests <a href="https://acsc.speedwaiver.com/cnbeu">https://acsc.speedwaiver.com/cnbeu</a>.

**Safety Meetings** - will be held in the Audi Club Big Top Tent at the Track on **Friday evening**. There is a Meet & Greet with heavy appetizers starting at 5:30 PM, so you won't need to leave the track to go offsite for supper. The First-Timer and Instructor meetings kick off at 7:00 PM that evening, followed by the **mandatory all-drivers meeting** at 8:00 PM. See the preliminary schedule in the <u>MSReg</u> event listing for other important times. A detailed event schedule will be available at onsite check-in.



Trackside Chats – Based on member feedback, we are featuring a brand-new set of Tech Talks during the event. Brief descriptions of the topics are at the end of this letter.

Passing Protocol - Passing in all run groups will be by permission-only in designated passing zones using the **point-by** protocol on **either side** at the discretion of the car being passed.

**NEW:** D-Group (advanced) and X/Y-Group (instructor) Passing – Please see the advanced driver supplement at the end of this letter for some introductory information about expanded passing opportunities on Friday and in your weekend advanced run groups.

Open Top Cars - If you are driving an open top car, it is your responsibility to provide arm-restraints for both Driver and Passengers. Additionally, both occupants must wear eye protection.

**Friday** - Our experienced drivers are joining us on Friday for the optional Experienced Driver Day. Everyone else is welcome and encouraged to attend Friday to watch the action and get a ride with one of our instructors. Go to MSReg and add Friday to your registration, or email us at AudiSoCalRegistrar@audiclubsocal.org and we will help you add Friday to your entry.

Speed Secrets - First-time performance drivers must complete the Speed Secrets *Performance Driving* 101 e-course prior to arriving at the event. If you turn in a copy of your completion certificate to your A-Group classroom leader, the club will refund \$39.50, the discounted cost of your course. Visit learn.speedsecrets.com and use discount code SoCalAudi-50 at checkout. While this is only mandatory for first-time performance drivers, we encourage all our drivers to take advantage of the special 50% discount Ross Bentley has graciously offered to Audi Club drivers on lifetime subscriptions to his outstanding online training courses.

Meals – We eat very well at an Audi Club HPDE! Those who attended last year know the quality of the menus designed by Zeke in cooperation with the track's experienced lead chef and catered by the kitchen crew.

- You may purchase a no-host **breakfast** at the Tower Café each morning starting at 7:00 AM.
- Friday, Saturday and Sunday Lunch is included with every driving school registration. Guests may purchase lunch at the Tower Café lunch counter.
- The Saturday evening **Banquet** in the Audi Club Tent is a very popular fun evening. We have some great items to raffle/auction in support of the chapter; among them are a set of four Toyo Tires for your car and professional photographs of you and your car on track. But there will also be plenty of time to visit with your new and old friends as you rehash the happenings of your day on track. If you didn't pre-order, Banquet tickets may be purchased at the on-site check-in desk in the Tower Café.

Eat three squares daily and start drinking water early and stay hydrated throughout the day to ensure your peak personal performance. Audi Club will provide complimentary **drinking water** under the awning in front of the Tower Café.

Weather and Clothing – Late November weather has traditionally been very nice, with cold mornings and pleasant days. The weather has been unusually fickle this year, so we encourage you to bring and wear layered clothing appropriate for varied conditions. The souvenir shirt for this event is a shortsleeve pocket tee. While we allow (but do not encourage) short sleeve shirts and short pants at our events, given the expected cool weather and for your own protection we suggest that long pants and long sleeve shirts are a better choice for base layers at a HPDE, so bring long sleeve shirts. We also require



practical, flexible-sole, closed-toe shoes while performance driving. Clothing should be made of cotton or wool blends or other fire-resistant materials. Jeans and a long-sleeve tee shirt are fine. Finally, driving gloves can be a welcome addition during those cold mornings at speed with your windows down.

Alcohol, Medications, and Recreational Drugs – None of these have a place at a performance driving event! The latest Auto Club magazine *Westways* relates a survey of thousands of drivers in which *about half* reported using one or more driver-impairing medications which can cause dizziness, sleepiness, fainting, and attention problems during the previous 30 days, whether OTC or prescription. These included antihistamines, antidepressants, and pain medications, among others. Many drivers weren't aware of the effects of their medicines on safe driving. Please leave the meds and cocktails at home. Check yourself and your fellow drivers for safety during the day. There will be no open containers by anyone until the track goes cold at 5:00 PM each day. Hydrate and Eat regularly and well; stay Healthy; be Safe!

**Location** - Buttonwillow Raceway Park is located 1/4-mile West of Interstate 5 at the Lerdo Hwy exit. The street address is 24551 Lerdo Hwy, Buttonwillow, CA 93206. It's a couple-hour drive from LA, more from points south. Check your maps app for estimates from your location.

## **Trackside Chats**

These tech talks are of interest to and appropriate for drivers of all experience levels. Please be sure to find these on the detailed schedule you will receive at on-site check-in. Make time during your day to attend as many of these interesting presentations as you can, given your own classroom and driving schedule. Most will be held in the upstairs Tower classroom; Corner Observation will be trackside and Car Mods at a table in the Tower Café.

- **BW Preview** Right after the Saturday morning safety briefing. Get a jump on driving Buttonwillow for all Drivers Deeno will be showing his ever-popular incar video of Buttonwillow. Alex will discuss the safety features of this weekend's track configuration.
- Paint Protection Saturday morning.

  Randy shares his knowledge of paint protection gleaned from years of operating his detail shop and shares tips for caring for your Audi's finish at a HPDE event.
- Car Mods for HPDE Saturday lunchtime.
   AJ gives an overview of mechanical modifications to your HPDE car, and when you should (and shouldn't) consider doing them. This is a great opportunity to ask questions about the true value of those cool goodies vendors want to sell us for our cars.
- Ask PJ Saturday afternoon.

  Discuss driving technique in an informal Q&A setting. PJ always gets rave reviews for his detailed insight into driving Buttonwillow. *Not a gripe session about passing!*
- Garmin Catalyst Saturday afternoon.

  Paul goes in-depth on the amazing Garmin Catalyst driving analyzer and digital coach. Learn the best use of this device to improve your own track driving.
- Corner Observation Sunday morning.

  Join Michael alongside the track to observe and analyze the line and car dynamics of drivers negotiating some of those tricky sections of Buttonwillow.
- Tire Preparation for HPDE Sunday morning.

  David will discuss pressure / temps / compounds / tread / torques for HPDE. Get answers to your pressing questions about those mysterious round black sticky things underneath your car. We usually take them for granted but they take on increased importance for Performance Driving.

## Advanced Driver Expanded Passing Zones Supplement Buttonwillow Raceway Park November 17-19, 2023

At the end of the lunch hour on Friday Erin will brief all Friday drivers on two fun exercises for exploring "expanded" passing zones. This will be followed by two brief slow-speed sessions immediately after lunch so we can get comfortable with being side-by-side in places we are not used to doing so. The remainder of Friday afternoon's open pit lane time will be run under the expanded passing zone rules.

If everything goes smoothly on Friday and our drivers exercise good situational awareness and drive conservatively, we intend to implement these expanded passing opportunities in the D, X, and Y run groups on the weekend.

We will discuss these expanded passing zones during Friday lunch and will review/debrief again during Friday evening's meetings. If you are a D/X/Y driver who has not registered for Friday, we strongly encourage you to reconsider. We'd like everyone to participate in these drills as they are invaluable for getting comfortable with the new passing regime. If it is tough to get away early, try to at least be there by lunch on Friday. Reach out if you need help amending your registration to add Friday.
